The Minor Agreement form must be in process before undertaking any study abroad, or prior to beginning upper-division coursework in the minor. Total units required to complete minor: 24. Minimum GPA required: 2.00 in minor courses. Completion of the above program of study will meet the requirements for graduation with an academic minor. No transfer credit substitutions will be granted for study abroad coursework or internships unless prior approval obtained. **Student is responsible for monitoring progress towards the minor and for verifying that advisor-approved substitutions appear in the student's Degree Progress Report.**
